

#### About the Tablature...

This month's tab is a well-known vaudeville tune, "By the Light of the Silvery Moon." The song was published in 1909 and first sung on stage in the Ziegfeld Follies around 1910. The tune is one of a series of songs from the Tin Pan Alley era.



Tin Pan Alley was the publishing center for the musical world from the late 1800s through the 1920s. As American cities grew, the transformation of music into a wholly American art form took place with the music of the Civil War era and ragtime.

The name "Tin Pan Alley" is attributed to a newspaper writer named Monroe Rosenfeld. While he was staying in New York, he coined the term to articulate the cacophony of dozens of pianos being pounded at once in publisher's demo rooms. He said it sounded like hundreds of people pounding on tin pans.

The club still meets with some of its members twice a week on-line to enhance their music experience. They have also restarted their once-a-month in-person meetings at the Young America Music Schools in Macon. Virtual gatherings have allowed club members that have moved farther away to continue to play music with their beloved club. The club's members all agree though that playing music live with others is the ultimate way to enjoy their music.

Most of the members of the Middle Georgia Dulcimer Club don't reside near the meeting location in Macon, making it challenging to get together to play as a group for community events. The mighty Middle

Georgia club is up to those challenges though. The club enjoys performing at interpretive events at the Jarrell Plantation State Historic Site in Juliette. A couple of members offered music at the Frontier Days Festival at The Parks at Chehaw in

Albany. Residents at the Carlyle Place assisted living center in Macon, where one of the club's members resides, have also enjoyed music provided by the club.

A couple of the Middle Georgia club members also provide dulcimer lessons elsewhere. NGFDA Treasurer, Barbara Stevens, a former leader of the Middle Georgia club, has since moved to Fort Myers, FL. She is currently seeking a dulcimer club to join there while continuing to meet with the Middle Georgia club on-line. She also continues to offer virtual lessons when requested.

Vicki Allen, a co-leader of the Middle Georgia club, offers dulcimer instruction with her group called **Two or More Dulcimer Club** that meets once a week in Dexter. Vicki also enjoys playing her dulcimer at events with the *Whitewater Longhunters*. The *Whitewater Longhunters* participate in pre-1840 encampments and rendevous: setting up frontier camps, providing weapons demonstrations and other frontier crafts and skills to educate the public about that fascinating part of history. Where the *Whitewater Longhunters* are, you'll find historical music being performed. Vicki gets excited when she leaves to attend a *Whitewater Longhunters* rendezvous. She says, "I'm gone to play my dulcimer for four days!"



## 2023 Bluebirds & Bluegrass Festival

After a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic, Dauset Trails Nature Center hosted its 20th annual Bluebirds and Bluegrass Festival on Saturday, April 23, combining music and enthusiasm for the outdoors. Each year during the free festival, the nonprofit nature center and animal sanctuary invites musical artists, vendors and other area nature centers and outdoor recreation groups for a celebration of spring.



Two dulcimer clubs, the **Dixieland Dulcimers** and the **Middle Georgia Dulcimer Club**, connected to provide music and educational information about the dulcimer at that event. Bringing clubs together has advantages. It exposes members to different types of music and instruments and teaches you new things. When groups join and playing styles differ, it expands your musical knowledge and raises your playing confidence level. When novice players play with more experienced musicians, they get motivated to become better musicians.



On the other side of the park, a member of the **LaGrange Troupers** participated in a living history demonstration, sharing the dulcimer top 40 from the 1860s and introducing the instrument to kids of all ages.

#### How did you get started playing the dulcimer?

I was at a fair in Gay, GA several years ago. There I purchased a mountain dulcimer after seeing Robert Mize playing one.

#### Is your family musical?

My father played marimba. My mother played Hawaiian steel guitar. My brother played guitar and my sister played the accordion. I accompanied them on harmonica and marimba. My musical family and I provided music for square dances on Saturday and played Sunday church music on the local radio station.

#### Do you play any other instruments?

Besides playing the mountain dulcimer, I play the harmonica and the marimba.

#### Do you read music or play by ear?

I read music and play by ear. I also enjoy playing fill-ins and embellishments.

#### How long have you been a member of the Middle Georgia Dulcimer Club?

I met the Middle Georgia Dulcimer Club over 20 years ago at the Mossy Creek Barnyard Festival in Centerville, GA and joined their club.

#### How long have you been a member of the Dixieland Dulcimers?

I started performing with the Dixieland Dulcimers years before I joined their group when I retired 5 years ago.

#### What is your favorite song?

*How Great Thou Art* is one of my several favorite songs.

#### Who would you like to play a duet with?

Most anyone.

#### Have you taught the dulcimer to others?

I have taught basic dulcimer playing skills to others, but I leave serious teaching to the experts.

#### What advice would you give to a beginning dulcimer player?

Practice and don't worry about mistakes.

#### What else do you do when you're not playing the dulcimer?

Boating, travel, listening to other music, and playing my harmonicas.


